

Academic and general understanding of modern Europe and the Middle East has been severely harmed because many scholars of political, intellectual or cultural history fail to integrate the analysis of Zionism into the context of contemporaneous Central and Eastern European development.

To study Zionism as a case of Jewish exceptionalism begs important ethical questions, conceals the connections of Zionism to similar Central and Eastern European political movements and is probably racist.
